### MUNICIPAL CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT STUDY West River Wastewater Pumping Station and Forcemain Oakville, Ontario PR-2964A

#### Background

Halton Region is undertaking a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study for the West River Wastewater Pumping Station and Forcemain in the Town of Oakville. The need for additional capacity at the West River wastewater pumping station was identified in the 2011 Sustainable Halton Water and Wastewater Master Plan.

A wide range of alternatives have been considered to address wastewater conveyance requirements in the vicinity of the West River Wastewater Pumping Station. The impact of the various alternatives on social, cultural, economic, and natural environments have been evaluated and assessed during the Study.

#### Process

The Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study is being carried out in accordance with Schedule B of the *Municipal Class Environmental Assessment* document (October 2000, as amended 2007, 2011 & 2015), which is an approved process under the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act*.

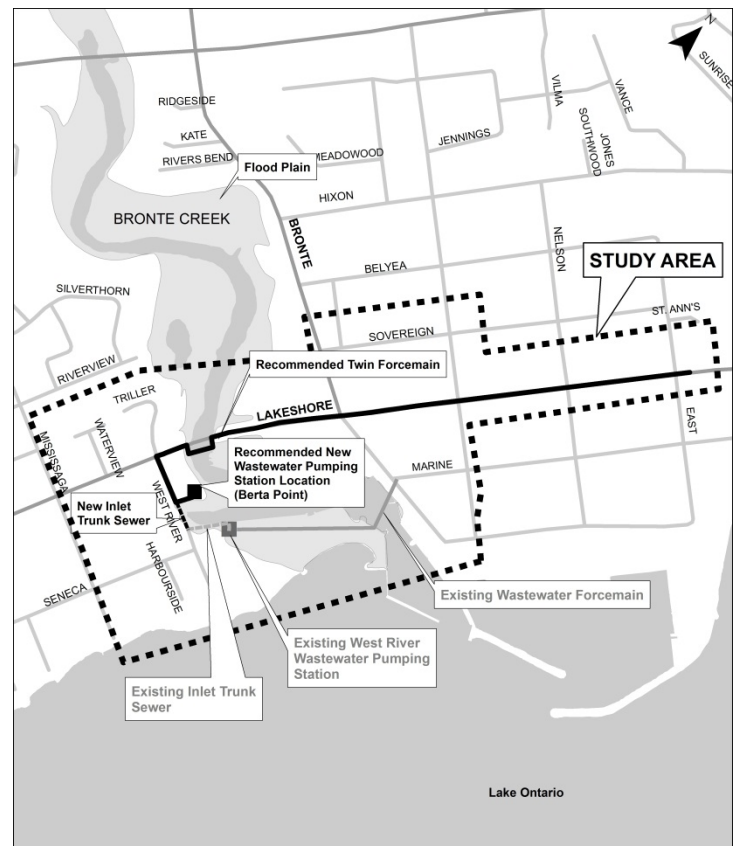
