

¹ A Child Care Service Management Agreement (CCSMA) is the agreement between a licensed child care operator (or licensed home child care agency) and Halton Region which allows access to funding that supports high quality, inclusive, and affordable child care in Halton.

² A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is the agreement between a licensed child care operator (or licensed home child care agency) and Halton Region Inclusion Services that supports quality inclusion of children with special needs in licensed centre-based and private-home child care programs.
