Service Animal & Pet Survival Kit

Here are the basic items everyone with a service animal or pet should have prepared in advance to keep their friend comfortable during the stress of an emergency situation. Keep all items in a transportable bag that is easy to access should you need to evacuate your home. Also, remember to check the kit twice a year to ensure freshness of food, water and medication and to restock any supplies you may have borrowed from the kit.

\Box	Minimum 72 nour supply of bottled water and food
	Paper towels, can opener, and bowls, as required
	Medications with a list identifying reasons (e.g., medical condition), dosage, frequency and contact information of prescribing veterinarian
	Medical records including vaccinations (note that most boarding facilities will not accept pets without proof of current vaccination records)
	Leash/harness/muzzle (if required)
	Animal first aid kit
	Blankets/towels and favourite toy
	Plastic bags
	Litter pan, litter, scooper
	Up-to-date ID tag with your phone number and name/ phone number of your veterinarian (microchipping is also recommended)
	Current photo of your service animal or pet in case it gets lost or separated from you
	Information on pet's feeding schedule, behavioural/ medical concerns and special instructions in case pet needs to be boarded
	List of boarding facilities, friends/relatives pets could stay with as emergency shelters are typically designated for people only, except for service animals
	Paperwork showing proof of service animal status
	Copy of licence (if required)
