Dear Parents and Guardians,

Following <u>Provincial direction</u>, children five to 11 years of age are eligible to receive their first booster dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. Children in this age group may receive their first booster dose at a recommended interval of six months (or 168 days) after their second dose. Children who are immunocompromised and received a three-dose primary series are recommended to receive their first booster dose 6 months (or 168 days) after their third dose.

Booster doses are effective in preventing severe illness and hospitalization from a COVID-19 infection. The protection from the vaccines may decrease over time. Evidence suggests booster dose(s) restore protection against the virus, including against new variants of the COVID-19 virus. We encourage families to stay up-to-date on all recommended doses of the COVID-19 vaccine to protect children, families and the community.

Children who had a previous COVID-19 infection are recommended to receive a booster dose to improve their immune response as it may provide better and longer-lasting protection against current and future variants of the virus. - Participating primary care providers or
- Participating pharmacies
