Halton Region Housing & Homelessness Programs and Services

Halton Access to Community Housing

If you require a government subsidy to help pay your rent, you can apply to Halton Access to Community Housing (HATCH) – Halton Region's community housing waitlist.

HATCH manages the waitlist for the following types of housing assistance:

- **Rent-geared-to-income (RGI)**: subsidized units in properties across Halton region, including specialized units for wheelchair accessibility and supports with daily living.
- Portable Housing Benefits: monthly housing benefit to assist with rental costs in the private housing market.

Housing Stability Fund

If you are at imminent risk of eviction/ homelessness, then immediate support is available through the Housing Stability Fund (HSF). This program provides one-time assistance and case management support to eligible Halton residents with the following:

- rental arrears
- last month's rent
- utility arrears
- moving and storage costs
- furniture acquisition

This program aims to prevent homelessness and help residents gain and retain affordable rental housing in Halton Region.

Halton Housing Help

If you have challenges finding affordable rental housing in Halton Region you can access assistance through Halton Housing Help (HHH).

HHH staff can help with:

- Virtual or in-person support to help find and access affordable rental housing listings
- Assistance accessing community support services
