RE: Novel Coronavirus in Wuhan, China

QUICK FACTS

- Chinese authorities suspect a novel coronavirus (nCoV) is responsible for an outbreak of viral pneumonia associated with a seafood market in Wuhan, China. The market was closed on January 1, 2020.
- The situation continues to evolve. The latest information is available through the World Health Organization and the Public Health Agency of Canada.
- As of January 11, 2020, 41 persons have been diagnosed with nCoV, and 1 death has been reported. There is currently no evidence of human-to-human spread.
- Persons under investigation (PUI) associated with this cluster have also been identified in neighbouring countries (Hong Kong, Thailand, Sourth Korea). All with a travel history to Wuhan.

KEY MESSAGES FOR HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS

- Hospitals and Health Care Workers should identify patients who meet the following criteria:
 - o fever and acute respiratory illness OR pneumonia AND
 - o travel to the city of Wuhan, China within 14 days of illness onset.
- In addition to <u>Routine Infection Prevention and Control Practices</u>, individuals who meet the
 above criteria should be placed on <u>Droplet/Contact Precautions</u>; in a single room and
 preferably with negative pressure in case aerosol-generating procedures are performed. <u>N95</u>
 respirator is to be worn for aerosol-generating procedures and during the collection of
 laboratory specimens.
- Hospitals should notify their infection Prevention and Control departments and the Ministry of Health at 1-866-212-2272 of a PUI without disclosing Personal Health Information.
- Public Health Ontario Laboratory's testing guidance for Wuhan nCoV is available online.

KEY MESSAGES FOR PATIENTS

- Currently, the risk of infection with the novel coronavirus in Ontario is low.
- Travellers should consult the <u>Travel Canada website</u> for the latest health advice prior to departure.
