RE: COVID-19 Vaccine Update 33: Eligibility opening to 50+ who cannot work from home and 16+

Indigenous people; updated homebound patient referral form

QUICK FACTS

- On Friday, April 30, all Indigenous people 16 years of age and over (including First Nations, Métis, and Inuit populations) who live in Halton will be eligible to book COVID-19 vaccination at halton.ca/COVIDvaccines.
- Starting **Monday**, **May 3**, Halton residents who are 50 years of age and older and cannot work from home can book a COVID-19 vaccination appointment at halton.ca/COVIDvaccines.
- While Group 1 Essential Workers still need a letter from their employer, this new group of 50+ who cannot
 work from home, do not need a letter from their employer, but must attest to working outside of the home
 and provide proof of residency at their appointment.
- Halton Region Public Health does not have the authority to grant exceptions to eligibility.
- Residents 40+ are eligible for vaccination through participating pharmacies and primary care offices. Participating pharmacies are listed at Ontario.ca/PharmacyCovidVaccine.

DETAILS RE: VACCINATIONS FOR 16 AND 17 YEAR OLDS

- Halton residents who are 16 and 17 years of age who are <u>eligible</u> as part of non-age based cohorts will be able to book their vaccination appointments <u>online</u> at <u>halton.ca/COVIDvaccines</u>. Eligibility includes:
 - o those living in Milton L9E postal code area (starting Friday, April 30);
 - o Indigenous people 16 years of age and older (starting Friday, April 30);
 - o individuals with eligible health conditions;
 - o Group 1 essential workers, healthcare workers who cannot work from home;
 - o chronic homecare recipients; and
 - staff and essential caregivers of long-term care, retirement homes, congregate or assisted living facilities.
- Residents who are 16 or 17 years old will be vaccinated with the Pfizer vaccine.
- Eligible residents must have had their 16th birthday on or before the date of the first dose appointment.
