## RIFAMPIN SHORTAGE

- There is an ongoing national shortage of Rifampin 150mg and 300mg capsules indicated for treatment of active tuberculosis (TB) and latent tuberculosis infection (LTBI).
- Adequate inventory levels are expected to be re-established in late March 2023.

## PLEASE PRIORITIZE RIFAMPIN FOR THE FOLLOWING PATIENTS:

- Individuals with active TB disease
- Individuals who have already started a preventive treatment regimen for LTBI that includes Rifampin (e.g., 4RMP)
- Contacts who have LTBI and the source case has an isoniazid-resistant strain of TB
- Contacts who need window prophylaxis pending definitive LTBI testing (e.g., children < 5 years of age, immuno-suppressed/people with HIV)

Defer starting rifampin for any new LTBI cases that are at a moderate or low risk of progressing to active TB disease until the shortage is resolved. Consider prescribing isoniazid as an alternative LTBI treatment.
