## What's new for Halton physicians



#### Immunizing students to avoid suspension

In order to attend school, children must have legally required immunizations. Halton Region is enforcing the provincial *Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA)* to help keep our students and schools healthy. Starting in September, there will be a new online immunization reporting form for parents. Until then, parents can dial 311 to report their immunizations to help avoid school suspension.
