RE: COVID-19 Vaccine Update 60: youth vaccination eligibility change, third doses, mandatory vaccination policies, upcoming webinar

QUICK FACTS

- The Government of Ontario issued a <u>press release</u> yesterday with the following changes:
 - All children born in 2009 or later are now eligible to receive the Pfizer vaccine, regardless of whether their 12th birthday has passed yet.
 - Third vaccine doses will now be offered to certain groups of patients at higher risk of severe outcomes (see below).
 - Mandatory vaccination policies will now be required for hospitals, home and community care service providers, and ambulance services.

EXPANDED VACCINE ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN

- As of Wednesday, August 18, children born in 2009 can receive the Pfizer vaccine prior to their 12th birthday at any Public Health Clinic providing Pfizer on a walk-in basis, at participating primary care clinics and pharmacies.
- If you would like to register your clinic to provide the COVID-19 vaccine, please email doctors@halton.ca.
- The decision was based on several months of data from Alberta and BC where this policy has been in place and no safety concerns have been identified.
- Anticipated surge in demand may result in temporary line ups, so residents are encouraged to dress appropriately for the weather and bring water to stay hydrated.

THIRD DOSES

- Third doses are not yet available at Halton Region Public Health Clinics. Public Health is working to implement this direction as soon as possible and will update you once available.
- <u>Third COVID-19 vaccine doses will be offered</u> to certain high risk groups to provide additional protection:

- Transplant recipients (including solid organ transplant and hematopoietic stem cell transplants);
- Patients with hematological cancers (examples include lymphoma, myeloma, leukemia) on active treatment (chemotherapy, targeted therapies, immunotherapy);
- o Recipients of an anti-CD20 agent (e.g. rituximab, ocrelizumab, ofatumumab); and
- Residents of high-risk congregate settings including long-term care homes, higher-risk licensed retirement homes and First Nations elder care lodges.
- For transplant recipients, patients with hematological cancers, and recipients of an anti-CD20 agent, there is a minimum 8-week interval between the second dose and the third dose.
- For residents of long-term care homes and high risk retirement homes, there is a minimum 5 month delay after the second dose.
- The <u>FDA</u> and <u>CDC's</u> Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recently authorized a
 third dose for similar indications. A NACI statement regarding third doses is expected in
 September.

MANDATORY VACCINATION POLICIES

- The Chief Medical Officer of Health has issued a directive requiring all public hospitals, home and community care providers, and ambulance services to have a vaccination policy, which will require proof of one of the following:
 - Full vaccination against COVID-19;
 - o A medical reason for not being vaccinated against COVID-19; or
 - o Completion of a COVID-19 vaccination educational session.
- Those who do not provide proof of vaccination will be required to undertake regular antigen testing.
- The policy must be effective by September 7, 2021.
