During the subsequent detailed design and construction phase, a Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment will be completed. The Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment work and subsequent recommendations will be scheduled in advance of any project activities that may have the potential to disturb archaeological resources. Prior to undertaking this Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment work, Wendat Nation will be advised and afforded the opportunity to have field liaison representative participation.


