The need for greater connectivity and mobility (to 2031) in the southeast quadrant of the Town of Halton Hills was identified in both the Halton-Peel Boundary Area Transportation Study (HPBATS) and the Region's Transportation Master Plan – The Road to Change.


#### **Process**

This notice signals the commencement of the Municipal Class EA Study, which will define the problem, identify and evaluate alternative solutions, and determine a preferred solution in consultation with the Town of Halton Hills, regulatory agencies and the public. 

### Good Evening:

The weekend Independent Free Press identified the commencement of the Norval West Bypass Transportation Corridor Improvements. I write to highlight our local organization known as the "Norval Community Association," incorporated in 1976 but in existence much longer. I write as the President of the organization but not from direction of the board at this time.

I write tonight to ensure that you might accommodate an early community meeting with our organization, Halton Hills planning staff and yourselves, so that we can highlight some of our thoughts.

The most recent process for upgrades to Adamson Street in the village of Norval was in my opinion lacking in foresight. Firstly to be clear Adamson Street is not Winston Churchill BLVD. but a village street with significant historic value to our community and the world. More on this later in my comments.

Adamson Street is a given road and Winston Churchill Blvd. does not continue through the village. This should be addressed or the continued impact on the village will just get worse.

Firstly, the Halton Region approved Norval Secondary Plan was sadly ignored during the construction of Adamson Street. Here are some examples: ancient telephone poles (1950 era) were left embedded into new pavement, no interlocking brick, no fancy street lamps, no trees planted, no gateway signage installed, or other features identified in the secondary plan were incorporated in the new roadworks. The modern telephone poles should be buried, ancient telephone poles removed and light fixtures in keeping with the historic village should be installed. None of these happened and it wasn't for lack of trying to get someone to listen to the needs of the village.

Famous Canadian author Lucy Maud Montgomery lived in Norval from 1926-1935 and visitor's from all over the world presently visit Norval. The local heritage society purchased the author's house with a vision of creating an

international tourist site and museum.

I personally welcome the bypass road but really want to stress that after years of discussion about the Adamson Street improvements our Norval Secondary Plan were almost completely ignored. I hope it will be different during this process.

I am leaving for Australia on February 17 returning on April 21. I do hope that you both will take time to read the Norval Secondary Plan and ensure guidelines are incorporated into your new plans to protect all that we value in Norval.

Please let me know next steps.
