1. Canada Wide Early Learning and Child Care System – Introductory Webinar Follow-up

On Friday May 13, 2022, Halton Region hosted a webinar for local child care and early years service providers on the Canada Wide Early Learning and Child Care (CWELCC) System. The webinar provided an overview of the provincial CWELCC Guidelines and next steps for implementation of the CWELCC System in Halton.

As many of you know, parents/caregivers want information about the CWELCC System, particularly as it affects their child care fees. A letter to parents/caregivers is attached. Please share this letter with families that attend your programs.

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2. Halton Early Years and Child Care Workforce Strategy – ECE Bursaries and Grants Now Available

I am pleased to announce that Halton Region will be providing funding to increase the number of Early Childhood Education (ECE) graduates and reduce financial barriers for 1,900 students entering the field. Under Halton's Early Years and Child Care Workforce Strategy and the Canada-Ontario Early Childhood Workforce Agreement, this initiative aims to grow the number of qualified professionals and supports the recruitment of a high-quality early years and child care workforce.

Through a collaborative investment with the City of Toronto, Region of Peel and Region of Durham, students at four institutions in the Greater Toronto Area will have an opportunity to complete their ECE diploma while receiving funding to cover the cost of tuition. Through this initiative, 210 new graduates will be ready to enter the field by the Fall of 2023 and play a vital role in creating a high-quality early learning and child care system.

Bursaries that will fund 100% of tuition costs will be offered at:

- Centennial College (registration open for July 2022)
- Durham College (registration open for July 2022)
- George Brown College (registration open for July 2022)
- Mothercraft College (registration opening soon for January 2023)

This investment will also reduce financial barriers by providing additional grants to support the cost of books and technology for students in both the compressed and two-year diploma programs starting in September 2022 and January 2023 at:

- Centennial College
- Durham College
- George Brown College
- Humber College
- Mothercraft College
- Seneca College
- Sheridan College
