## Immunizing students to avoid suspension

For the 2016-17 school year, the Halton Region Health Department is focused on ensuring the immunization records of students born in 1999-2000 are complete and will be issuing suspension notices for this age group early in 2017. We ask that you also encourage parents of patients who are age 5-7 to ensure their children's immunization records are up-to-date and reported to the Health Department. #### Reporting immunizations

When immunizing children and especially students facing suspension, please remind your patients of the importance of reporting all immunizations and exemptions to the Halton Region Health Department by dialing 311 or online at **halton.ca/immunize**.

### Supporting patients who want to stop smoking

To support patients who want to quit using tobacco, and who will benefit from 1:1 counseling, let them know about the Halton Region Health Department's STOP Smoking Clinic. The clinic is offered in four locations throughout Halton and provides free individual counseling and nicotine replacement to eligible tobacco users.
