The journey began with the Growth Plan ...

- Provincial Growth Plan, Places to Grow, was released in June 2006 and backed by The Places to Grow Act 2005
- Halton must plan for 780,000 people and 390,000 jobs by 2031
- Intensification & density targets
- Results—land needs reduced to half of what would have been if business as usual

Prime Agricultural Areas





Growth Plan rules ...

- Intensification: starting in 2015, at least 4 out of every 10 new housing units in the Built-up Area
- Greenfield density: minimum 50 persons plus jobs per ha
- Urban Growth Centre (UGC): minimum 200 persons plus jobs per ha





What would these rules mean?

- Between 2015 and 2031 ...
- 32,200 housing units added to Built-up Area
- •Mostly apartments:
- -Housing mix will change:

```
From 60%: 30%: 10%
To 40%: 30%: 30%
```

- Challenges:
 - > Would the demand be there?
 - Would family households choose to live in an apartment?
- Greenfields will be left with mostly low density housing for a while




Land needs have been refined from Phase 2...

Applying evaluation framework ...

- Protecting natural resources
 - Comparable among 3 concepts
- Fostering sustainable, complete communities
 - Concept 2 is preferred
- Ensuring cost-efficient infrastructure
 - > Comparable among 3 concepts
 - Concept 1 marginally preferred
- Promoting health
 - Constant among 3 concepts





Concept 2 is preferred by Study Team ...

- Strikes a balance between land use & transit efficiency
- Allows Georgetown to evolve into a complete community
- Achieves overall sustainability in economic, social & environmental terms
- Shares growth and Growth Plan challenges among the four municipalities
- Provides more secure water supply to Georgetown


