# √ Starting a Corporation Checklist

# 1. ☐ STRUCTURE DESCRIPTION:

This type of structure grants you exclusive use of the business name. To further protect your business name, you would have to register a trademark/trade name.

### Advantages:

Limited liability of the owner(s)(generally limited to individual's personal investment in the business)
Continuous existence (no renewal, ownership transferable)
Easier to raise capital (money for the business can be raised by selling shares)

Possible tax advantages

# Disadvantages:

Most expensive and complicated form of business to organize Closely regulated, extensive corporate

records required, including shareholder and director meetings, documentation filed annually

Tax rules can be complex

# 2. REGISTERING A CORPORATION & NAME SEARCH

You can incorporate a business federally or provincially.

Nuans report must be filed with your Articles for both Provincial and Federal incorporations if you are seeking approval of a corporate name.

You may wish to retain the services of an accountant or lawyer to incorporate your business.

# Nuans.com Free search / to order a Nuans report cost \$13.80 per report

Nuans reports list similar corporate names and trademarks, except for names in Quebec. A Nuans report is valid for 90 days. If 90-day period has ended, you must order a new Nuans report to submit.

Getting a report does not mean that your proposed name has been approved. It simply means that the name has been reserved for you for 90 days while it is being reviewed for approval. The approval process varies by jurisdiction.

# 3. DEVELOP PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT

Anyone entering into a business partnership with one or more partners, including friends, family members, or spouses should have an agreement in writing.

A partnership agreement is a document used to dictate the terms of a business partnership between two or more partners. It will make the day-to-day operations of your partnership smoother and prevent problems in the future.

7. REGISTER WITH INDUSTRY SPECIFIC AGENCY (if applicable)  Determine whether any industry specific licenses and/or regulations that may apply to your business.	Many business including retail and service outlets, restaurant and lounges, manufacturing and processing operations, may be subject to licences. These licences are designed to protect the interest and safety of the public regarding the use, application or sale of certain items or services.  Visit: bizpal.ca

	Under this legislation, independent operators, sole proprietors, some partners in a partnership and some executive officers in a corporation carrying on a business in construction are required to have WSIB coverage (some exceptions apply).
9. ☐ OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY ACT (OHSA)	The OHSA legislates the rights and responsibilities for employers, supervisors and workers. Workplace safety is a shared responsibility.

10.□ BANK ACCOUNT	Visit your local financial institution with a copy of your Master Business Licence or Articles of Incorporation.

11.□ INSURANCE	There are different types of insurance that may apply to your business.  - Property, contents, vehicle and business interruption insurance.
