High Priority health care workers, extended interval and COVID-19 vaccine updates for Health Care Providers

QUICK FACTS

- Healthcare workers in the <u>Highest and Very High Priority groups</u>, including custodial, security and reception staff, can now <u>book their appointments online</u>.
- If unable to book online, please call 311 to book an appointment at the Halton COVID-19 Vaccination Centre at Oakville Trafalgar Memorial Hospital at 3001 Hospital Gate in Oakville.
- Eligibility has also been expanded to include those who live **or** work in Halton.
- If you are working remotely full-time, please do not book an appointment at this time. As vaccine supply increases, eligibility will be expanded.
- Please share attached letter with friends and colleagues, who live or work in Halton in the Highest and Very High Priority groups.
- Please note Ontario is following the recommendations form the National Advisory Committee on Immunization and extending the interval between the first and second dose of COVID-19 vaccine to 16 weeks.
- In our ongoing efforts to share information, please find a presentation that was discussed at the most recent COVID-19 Healthcare Advisory Round Table attached for your information.

HIGHEST PRIORITY

Frontline health care workers in the following sectors and settings (including custodial, reception, and other staff):

- All hospital and acute care staff in frontline roles with COVID-19 patients and/or with a high-risk of exposure to COVID-19, including those performing aerosol-generating procedures:
 - Critical Care Units
 - o Emergency Departments and Urgent Care Departments
 - COVID-19 Medical Units
 - Code Blue Teams, rapid response teams
 - General internal medicine and other specialists involved in the direct care of COVID-19 positive patients
- All patient-facing health care workers involved in the COVID-19 response:
 - COVID-19 Specimen Collection Centers (e.g., Assessment centers, community COVID-19 testing locations)
 - Teams supporting outbreak response (e.g., IPAC teams supporting outbreak management, inspectors in the patient environment, redeployed health care workers supporting outbreaks or staffing crisis in congregate living settings)
 - COVID-19 vaccine clinics and mobile immunization teams
 - Mobile Testing Teams
 - COVID-19 Isolation Centers

- COVID-19 Laboratory Services
- Medical First Responders (ORNGE, paramedics, firefighters providing medical first response).
- Community health care workers serving specialized populations including:
 - Needle exchange/syringe programs & supervised consumption and treatment services
 - Aboriginal Health Access Centers, Indigenous Community Health Centers, Indigenous Interprofessional Primary Care Teams, and Indigenous Nurse Practitioner-Led Clinics
 - Special considerations for the following:
 - Community Health Centers serving disproportionally affected communities and/or communities experiencing highest burden of health, social and economic impacts from COVID-19
 - Highly critical health care workers in remote and hard to access communities, e.g., sole practitioner
 - Home and community care health care workers caring for recipients of chronic homecare and seniors in congregate living facilities or providing hands-on care to COVID-19 patients in the community

VERY HIGH PRIORITY

Frontline health care workers in the following sectors and settings:

- Acute care and other hospital settings (patient care areas not included in Highest Priority (e.g., surgical care, obstetrics, etc.)).
- **Congregate settings** (assisted living, correctional settings, residential facilities, hospices and palliative care settings, shelters, supportive housing (outside of Highest Priority level)).
- Community care with high risk of exposure and serving specialized patient populations (Community Health Centers, Home and community care (outside of the Highest Priority level), Adult day programs for seniors).
- Other health care services for Indigenous populations (Community agencies with patient-facing providers delivering any type of health services to First Nations communities and Indigenous Peoples that are not captured in Highest Priority).
- Community care with high risk of exposure and serving the general population (Birth centres, Community Based Specialists, Death investigation professionals, Dentistry, Gynecology/obstetrics, Midwifery, Nurse practitioner-led clinics / contract nursing agencies, Otolaryngology (ENT), Pharmacies, Primary care, Respirology (Respiratory Therapy), Walk-in clinics).
- Laboratory services







'Highest' and 'Very High Priority' Health Care Workers can now book online for COVID-19 vaccine appointment

Who is eligible?

Highest and Very High Priority health care workers, as defined in the Ministry of Health's <u>Guidance for</u> <u>Prioritizing Health Care Workers for COVID-19 Vaccination</u>, are now eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine and can book appointments <u>online</u>. Such health care workers, including custodial, security and reception staff, may receive the COVID-19 vaccine at the Halton Healthcare Vaccination Centre at Oakville Trafalgar Memorial Hospital.

To be eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, health care workers must:

- work at one of the settings listed below AND
- work <u>or live in Halton Region AND</u>
- provide direct, in-person care to patients at least once a week.

How to book an appointment

- If you are eligible, please <u>go online</u> or call 311 to book your appointment.
- You will be asked to attest to your eligibility as a health care worker.
- Your online booking form will provide details of where to go and what to expect when you arrive.
- Your vaccine appointment will occur at the Halton COVID-19 Vaccination Centre at Oakville Trafalgar Memorial Hospital, located at 3001 Hospital Gate, Oakville, ON L6M 0L8.

Summary

Overview of current vaccination program

- Halton Healthcare reaching out to chronic homecare recipients to book appointments; waiting for direction on single dose vaccine for house bound patients
- Halton Region not part of provincial AstraZeneca pilot program
- Extended interval between doses for everyone except long-term care/retirement homes; second appointments will be re-booked
- Next populations for vaccination
- Healthcare toolkit



Current COVID-19 immunization groups

- Over 80 population
- Highest priority, Very High priority healthcare workers
- Retirement home residents, unregulated congregate care settings
- Chronic homecare recipients

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Over 80 population

- As of March 7:
 - 16,495 people have booked appointments

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• Represents around 73% of all adults 80+ in Halton





Healthcare Workers

- Highest Priority and Very High Priority Healthcare Workers currently booking
- Call volumes at Halton Healthcare have declined over the weekend, but call queues are long again.
- Hoping to have an online booking portal for healthcare workers soon.

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- Will also be available for :
 - Essential caregivers
 - Recipients of chronic home care.



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Chronic homecare recipients

- Halton Healthcare's call centre has started calling people receiving chronic homecare
- 40% of calls result in an appointment







Patients who are housebound

- Expecting provincial guidance re. moving single Moderna doses shortly
- Will advise once more is determined





Provincial AstraZeneca Pilot

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- Select pharmacies in Toronto, Windsor-Essex and Kingston, Frontenac, Lennox & Addington
- Eligible adults aged 60-64 can find participating pharmacies at ontario.ca/pharmacycovidvaccine
- Primary care pilot in Hamilton, Toronto, Guelph, Peterborough, Simcoe-Muskoka and Peel
- Primary care will contact eligible patients to book appointments directly

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Extended interval between doses

 NACI rapid response document recommending to extend the interval for the second dose to four months to maximize number of people benefitting from first dose








Phase Two Sequencing

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The timelines for completing Phase Two and vaccinating the general population in Phase Three are dependent on several factors awaiting clarification at this time, including vaccine supply and uptake which is estimated at 75%. **The sequencing below can be applied in any vaccine supply scenario.**



¹ In addition to other phase 1, populations: Residents, staff, essential caregivers (including family caregivers) and other employees in congregate living settings for seniors; Frontline HCWs; Adults in First Nations, Métis and inuit populations; and Adult recipients of chronic home health care.
² Including some caregivers of those with specific health conditions.

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Next group of healthcare workers

- High Priority Healthcare Workers
 - Community care with lower risk of exposure and serving special populations (developmental services, mental health and addictions services).
 - Community care with lower risk of exposure and serving general population Campus health, Community diagnostic imaging, Daycare/school nursing, Dietary / nutrition, Independent health facilities (e.g., Opticians/Optometry, Podiatry, Audiology, medical and surgical specialties), Naturopathy / Holistic care, Social work, Sexual health clinics).
 - Non-acute rehabilitation and therapy (Chiropractic, Chronic pain clinics, Kinesiology, Occupational therapy, Physiotherapy, Psychiatry, Psychology, Psychotherapy, Registered massage therapy / Acupuncture, Other therapy).

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• Public health (all other public health).



Phase 2 health conditions

Individuals with the following health conditions will be vaccinated in Phase 2:

Highest-risk (442K)

- Organ transplant recipients
- Hematopoietic stem cell transplant recipients
- People with neurological diseases in which respiratory function may be compromised (e.g., motor neuron disease, myasthenia gravis, multiple sclerosis)
- Haematological malignancy diagnosed <1 year
- Kidney disease eGFR< 30

High-risk (292K)

- Obesity (BMI > 40)
- Other treatments causing immunosuppression (e.g., chemotherapy, immunity- weakening medications)
- Intellectual or developmental disabilities (e.g., Down Syndrome)

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At-risk (2.2M)

- Immune deficiencies/ autoimmune disorders
- Stroke/cerebrovascular disease
- Dementia
- Diabetes
- Liver disease
- All other cancers
- Respiratory diseases
- Spleen problems
- Heart disease
- Hypertension with end organ damage
- Diagnosis of mental disorder
- Substance use disorders
- Thalassemia
- Pregnancy
- Immunocompromising health conditions
- Other disabilities requiring direct support care in the community
