

Dear Early Years and Child Care Operator,

I am reaching out on behalf of Halton Region Public Health to request your support in promoting COVID-19 vaccination among people of reproductive years.

What we know:

- Most pregnant individuals who become infected with SARS-CoV-2 will have mild-tomoderate symptoms and many can be asymptomatic
- Canadian and international data from large studies demonstrate that approximately 7-11% of pregnant women will require hospitalization for COVID-related morbidity and between 1-4% of pregnant women require admission to an intensive care unit (ICU)
- Pregnant women are at increased risk of admission to hospital, critical care and invasive ventilation
- The risk of severe morbidity from COVID- 19 in pregnant women appears to be associated with risk factors including age ≥ 35 years old, asthma, obesity, preexisting diabetes, preexisting hypertension and heart disease
- Canadian and US data show an increased risk of preterm birth associated with COVID-19 infection in pregnancy
- The Society of Obstetricians and Gynecologists of Ontario (SOGC) recommends that pregnant individuals should be offered vaccination against COVID-19 at any time during pregnancy or while breastfeeding if no contraindications exist

Key messages for people in their reproductive years:

- Vaccines are a routine standard of care for adults and children in Canada and are safe (whooping cough and flu vaccines)
- Infection from the COVID-19 virus is preventable with vaccination
- Pregnant people are at increased risk of complications, including premature birth, from COVID-19

- While pregnant people were not included in the COVID-19 original studies, many have now received the vaccine without evidence of harm
- The Society of Obstetricians and Gynecologists of Ontario (SOGC) recommends that pregnant people should be offered vaccination against COVID-19 at any time during pregnancy or while breastfeeding if no contraindications exist
- The National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI) recommends a complete two-dose vaccine series with an mRNA COVID-19 vaccine
- The COVID-19 vaccine is free and available to anyone over 12 years+
- We all have a collective responsibility in stopping the spread of COVID-19 #RollUpYourSleevesHalton!
