RE: Market Withdrawal of COVID-19 XBB Vaccines and Vaccine Distribution in Early October

## QUICK FACTS

- The Public Health Agency of Canada has issued a market withdrawal of all COVID-19 XBB vaccines. As of September 1, 2024, any remaining XBB vaccines in your vaccine fridge must be disposed of.
- The new KP.2 COVID-19 vaccine formulations are expected to be available in October, pending Health Canada authorization and delivery schedules from manufacturers.
- In early October, vaccine orders will be **paused for 2 weeks** to accommodate the influenza autoshipment schedule. During this time, routine vaccine orders will not be processed. Orders for highrisk vaccines will be approved on a case-by-case basis.

## **KEY MESSAGES FOR HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS**

#### COVID-19 XBB Vaccine Market Withdrawal

- Effective September 1, 2024, the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) has issued a market withdrawal of all COVID-19 XBB vaccines. This is in preparation for the approval of the new KP.2 formulations from Pfizer and Moderna for the fall 2024 respiratory illness campaign.
- As part of the authorization of the new formulations, Health Canada will remove strain identifiers (e.g., XBB/KP.2), allowing for a single drug identification number (DIN) per vaccine presentation.
- Due to this market withdrawal, as of September 1, 2024, all XBB vaccines at your facility must be disposed of.
- COVID-19 vaccines must be physically disposed of in your facility's biomedical waste container. Do not return COVID-19 vaccines to Public Health.
- Ensure that all doses administered have been documented in COVaxON. Enter any doses remaining in your inventory as waste.
  - Wastage of viable vaccine doses i.e., not yet expired, before beyond-use-date (BUD) should be recorded using the wastage reason of "Other" accompanied with the following note:
    "Doses wasted due to PHAC market withdrawal of all XBB vaccine products".
- As a result of this market withdrawal, COVID-19 vaccines will not be available until the new formulation of KP.2 vaccines are approved and distributed. Advise individuals that are seeking COVID-19 vaccination to wait for the new formulations. These vaccines are expected to be available in October and offer better protection against circulating COVID-19 strains.

### Fall Influenza Vaccination Campaign

- Starting in early October, influenza auto-shipments will be sent to your facility via Halton's vaccine courier service. The auto-shipment schedule will be shared at the end of September. Your facility will not be charged for auto-shipped influenza vaccine deliveries.
- The following table outlines the adjusted vaccine distribution schedule. Orders placed after the 'order by date' will not be processed until the 'next order by date'.
