





COVID-19 vaccines continue to provide strong protection against getting seriously ill, having to go to hospital or dying from COVID-19.

Why should I get a booster dose?

The protection you get from the vaccines may decrease over time. Evidence suggests booster dose(s) restore protection against the virus, including against new variants of the COVID-19 virus.

I have already had COVID-19, should I get a booster dose?


If you have had a COVID-19 infection, you are recommended to receive a booster dose to improve your immune response as it may provide better and longer-lasting protection against current and future variants of the virus.

The timing for when to receive your booster dose depends on when you had a COVID-19 infection. For more information, visit **halton.ca/COVIDvaccines**.

Which vaccine will you get for your booster dose?

The Province recommends an mRNA (Moderna or Pfizer) COVID-19 vaccine for booster doses (individuals 29 years of age and under are recommended to get Pfizer). Your booster dose can be a different vaccine than what you received for your primary series. Moderna and Pfizer use the same mRNA technology and have similar levels of effectiveness. Vaccine brands are commonly mixed in health care practice. Mixing vaccines is safe and effective.

You may be able to get your COVID-19 vaccine with other vaccines, such as the annual flu vaccine or other regularly scheduled vaccines. Speak with your health care provider for more information.

Vaccines approved by Health Canada are safe and help protect you, your family and our community from COVID-19.



Side effects from a booster dose of the COVID-19 vaccines appear to be similar to the side effects from the primary series. Common side effects include: pain at the injection site, fatigue, headache, muscle aches, joint stiffness, feeling unwell, chills, and fever.

Where can you get a booster dose of COVID-19 vaccine?

Eligible residents may get a booster dose from a Halton Community COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic, GO-VAXX bus, many local pharmacies or participating primary care providers.
