

Inclusion Services: Return to In-Person

Inclusion Services is excited to return to in-person services to support children and educators within your program. At this time, we will be offering a combination of in-person and virtual visits. The safe delivery of in-person services is our top priority.

Roles and Responsibilities of Resource Consultants

- Prior to entering the licensed child care centre, Resource Consultants will complete the [COVID-19 School and Child Care Screening](#) and adhere to the most recent [Ministry of Education – Child Care Guidance](#)
- In the event that your Resource Consultant does not pass the screen, they will contact you immediately to reschedule your in-person visit.
- During their visit, Resource Consultants will wear a medical mask and a face shield or approved eye protection.
- Resource Consultants will practice appropriate hand hygiene and physical distancing of two metres throughout their time in centre.
- Resource Consultants will disinfect all equipment and other items prior to entering the centre.
- To minimize transmission, Resource Consultants will provide service to **one child care centre/one classroom per day**.
- Resource Consultants can complete additional in-person consultations or observations within the centre if physically distanced of two metres or an outdoor visit is possible.
- Resource Consultants may provide service to up to **three** child care centres per week with approximately 48 hours in between visits.
- Zoom visits will continue in between in-person centre visits, as required.
- If a centre is closed to visitors, a virtual meeting or phone call will be arranged and in-person service will resume following direction by Halton Region Public Health.

Roles and Responsibilities of Child Care Centre Staff

- Child care Supervisor will inform their Resource Consultant of any exposures that may have occurred while they provided in-person service.
- Child care Supervisor will inform their Resource Consultant if an in-person visit is scheduled and the child care centre is in outbreak or closed to visitors.
- During outdoor visits, child care staff are asked to wear a mask and face shield or approved eye protection if physical distancing of two metres cannot be maintained.
