RE: COVID-19 Vaccine Update 21: Halton residents 75+ and Indigenous adults 55+ can now book COVID-19 vaccine appointments starting Friday, March 19

QUICK FACTS

- Starting Friday, March 19, the following groups of Halton residents will be eligible to [book appointments](#), at any of the five Halton Region COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic sites:
 - Adults aged 75 years or older
 - Indigenous adults (including First Nations, Métis, and Inuit populations) 55 years of age and older who live in Halton
- Clinics are by appointment only (please no walk-ins) and must be booked online through Halton Region's [booking system](#) at halton.ca/COVID19vaccines or through 311 if assistance is required. Please do not call clinic locations directly; bookings can only be made through Halton Region.
- Clinic locations are:

- Eligible residents, who are either 75 years of age and older or Indigenous adults aged 55 years of age or older, can call 311 if they require booking support. Please only call 311 if you are unable to book online to ensure those residents requiring support can be assisted.
- Halton Region is offering [transportation services](#) to and from appointments for residents who require support, free of charge.
- There will be appointments available to book for every eligible resident. All appointments are contingent on the availability of vaccine supply.
- Please note, no exceptions are being made to the current eligibility.

- Name and address (including postal code)
- Government issued I.D. (Ontario Health card preferred)
- Home phone number and/or mobile phone number, if applicable
- Email address is strongly recommended for confirmation email and notification in case of any changes
