#### Know the influenza risk in Halton

Sign up to receive the Influenza Surveillance Report by email or find it online at <u>halton.ca</u>. The weekly report provides information on flu activity, age distribution, subtype and emergency department visits in Halton.

#### Anticipate increased immunization requests in January to April 2019

In January 2019, students born in 2001-2004 (grades 9 to 12) whose immunization records are outof-date or who are overdue for a mandatory vaccine will receive a school suspension notice in the mail. The suspension period for this cohort starts February 7. **NEW for 2019** – Suspension notices will also be mailed to the 2010 (grade 3) cohort in February. The suspension period for the 2010 cohort starts March 25.

#### Protect patients from infections with proper reprocessing

When reprocessing medical equipment and devices, the level of reprocessing required is based on the type of patient contact and on the potential risk of infection involved in their use.
