Re: Notice of Appeal of a Decision of the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing pursuant to Section 17(36) of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990 C.P-13, as amended, in respect to a decision to approve with modifications Official Plan Amendment No. 38 to the Regional Halton Official Plan, as adopted by By-law No. 162-09

MMAH File No. 24-OP-0027-038

In a decision dated November 24, 2011, the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing approved, with modifications, OPA No. 38 to the Regional Municipality of Halton Official Plan.

This letter will serve as the City of Burlington's Notice of Appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board pursuant to Section 17(36) of the *Planning Act*. Please find enclosed herewith our cheque in the amount of \$125.00, made payable to the Minister of Finance.

City of Burlington Planning staff is of the opinion that a number of the components of the decision are not reflective of consultation undertaken by the Region with the public and with the four local municipalities. This appeal relates to, but is not limited to, the following specific policies and any other matters that may be identified by City Council:

Prime Agricultural Areas as a Land Use Designation (Minister's modifications to Map 1- Regional Structure, Map 1D- Prime Agricultural Areas, and Sections 51(5), 71(9), 77(7)).

The mapping and policies as revised identify Prime Agricultural Areas as a component of the Regional Structure and as a Designation within the Regional Official Plan. City of Burlington Planning staff has two concerns:

- The first relates to how this policy will be interpreted, especially where Prime Agricultural Areas overlay multiple other designations in the Regional Official Plan, each with their own objectives and policies.
- The second relates to the decision to identify additional Prime Agricultural Areas within the City of Burlington which were not identified in either Report 3.03 or 3.04 of the Sustainable Halton background reports.

Financing Human Services (Minister's modifications to Section 77(15) and 77(17)a)). City of Burlington staff is of the opinion that these policies should remain. The policies recognize that under the current legislation the development industry is not obligated to pay for human services. The policies at the same time recognize the critical importance of human services as they contribute to complete communities, and are supportive of the City's obligations under the Planning Act to provide for adequate provision of educational, health, social, cultural and recreational facilities.

Requirement for amendment to include in mapping Preliminary Route Planning Study areas (Minister's modifications to Section 173(5.1)(c)).

This new policy requires the Region and Local municipalities to prepare amendments to their respective plans once a new preliminary route planning study area is identified through a Provincial Environmental Assessment. City of Burlington Planning staff is of the opinion that these policies could have the effect of requiring the identification of the Niagara to GTA corridor, contrary to a Council approved position opposing the location of such a route. The new policy requires the City to accept a single approach to the exclusion of alternative approaches, which does not reflect local planning values.

Mineral Aggregate Policies (Minister's modifications to Section 107 through 110). Extensive modifications are proposed to the mineral aggregate resources policies. City of Burlington Planning Staff is of the opinion that the policy modifications are not supported by substantial evidence and that no evaluation has taken place of the effect of these modifications.

Regional Natural Heritage System modified to include the Greenbelt Natural Heritage System (Minister's modifications to Sections 51(2.1), 51.2(6), 71(3), and 115.4(3)

The Minister's modification resulted in the removal of the Greenbelt Plan area from the Regional Structure and merging of the Regional Natural Heritage System and the Greenbelt Natural Heritage System. City of Burlington Staff is of the opinion that the approach proposed does not reflect the findings of extensive consultations undertaken with residents and the local municipalities.

Modifications to Environmental Impact Assessment Requirements (Minister's modifications to Section 101(1.8), 118(3.1) and 118(3.3)).

A number of modifications are proposed regarding the Regional Natural Heritage System including a return to a *key features* based policy and modifications related to the application of the requirement for Environmental Impact Assessments. City of Burlington Planning Staff has two concerns:

- The first relates to requiring Environmental Impact Assessments only where development is within 120 metres of key features, rather than within 120 metres of the Regional Natural Heritage System.
- The second relates to the removal of specific direction related to agricultural building proposals. City of Burlington Staff believes that these policies gave clear direction to balance continued agricultural operation
- s while protecting the Regional Natural Heritage System as a whole.

The approach proposed in the modifications to ROPA 38 does not recognize local planning values related to the preservation of natural heritage.

Please note that this Notice of Appeal is being filed in advance of consideration by Council for the City of Burlington in order to comply with statutory appeal timeframes and, as such, is subject to Council direction.
