QUICK FACTS

- Halton is accelerating second doses; starting June 28, 2021 all residents who have received their first dose will be eligible to <u>reschedule their second dose</u> to an earlier date according to the minimum interval.
- Beginning mid-July 2021, Ontario Health will provide primary care providers who are part of a patient enrollment model (FHO, FHG, FHN, or CCM) with an online tool to help identify patients in their practice that have received a COVID-19 vaccine.
- A recording of the virtual Health Care Provider Town Hall held last week regarding adverse events following immunization is available, along with the slides.
- The COVID-19 Science Advisory Table for Ontario has published <u>Strategies to Support Ontarians'</u> Capability, Opportunity, and Motivation for COVID-19 Vaccination.
- The Ministry of Health published a <u>Vaccination in Pregnancy & Breastfeeding Patient Decision-Making</u> Tool.
- The Ministry of Health has published guidance on COVID-19 Vaccine Administration Errors and Deviations.

ACCELERATING SECOND DOSES

- Starting Monday, June 28, all residents who have received their first dose of COVID-19 vaccine will be able
 to reschedule their second dose to an earlier date, at a minimum 28-day interval, through Halton's online
 booking system.
- Individuals who received the AstraZeneca vaccine as their first dose, will continue to receive an interval of eight weeks or more, as per Provincial direction.
- In addition, all residents who are booking a first dose appointment will receive their second dose appointment at a minimum 28-day interval.

PATIENT VACCINATION REPORTS FOR PRIMARY CARE PROVIDERS

- The report includes vaccine type and date(s) received.
- A ONE® ID account is required to access the report.
- Once the online tool is up and running, you can use it to proactively identify and reach out to patients who may need your help in getting a COVID-19 vaccine.
