RE: COVID-19 Vaccine Update 101: Starting March 9, temporary, 6 week supply interruption of Infant Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine for children 6 months to 5 years

## QUICK FACTS

- Starting Thursday, March 9, 2023 across Canada, there will be a temporary supply interruption (up to six weeks) of Infant Moderna COVID-19 vaccine impacting children ages 6 months to < 5 years.
- The Ministry of Health is emailing families of children who are due to receive a second dose of Infant Moderna during the time of interruption.
- Children seeking for a dose of Moderna COVID-19 vaccine during the supply interruption may:
  - a. Have the child receive their next dose on or before Wednesday, March 8, 2023 (if the minimum interval of 28 days has passed);
  - b. Wait for the next dose until supply is restored: this is a feasible and safe option. Note that a delayed dose is valid and does not require restarting the series;
  - c. Receive a dose of Infant Pfizer-BioNTech (which is a three-dose series).
- During the time of anticipated interruption in the supply of Infant Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine, Halton Region COVID-19 community clinics (all ages 6 months+) will offer the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine to children 6 months to ≤ 5 years of age by appointment and walk in. Clinic location and hours are posted on <u>Halton's website</u>.

## **KEY MESSAGES FOR HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS**

- Moderna will continue to be offered until March 8.
- Use of the same vaccine product to complete the primary series in this age group continues to be preferred whenever possible. However, mixed series are still considered valid
  - For children who receive a dose of Infant Pfizer, completion of the primary series requires three doses.
